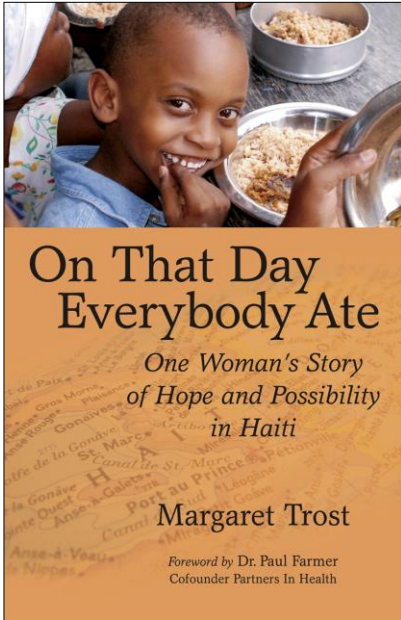


Hope and Possibility in Haiti
